About the KFG

The diffusion of ideas has become a central research theme in political science, sociology, law, history, and economics. Funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG), the Research College (KFG) investigates how ideas spread across time and space. During its first phase of research, from 2008-2012, the KFG studied the diffusion of policy ideas and institutions within the European Union, its candidates and neighborhood. During the second phase, from 2012-2016, the KFG realigns its focus of interest on the diffusion of ideas, policies, and institutions beyond Europe (comparative regionalism) and the analysis of the EU at the receiving end of external influences.
